



Town Hall Renovations

Dexter, Maine

Originally constructed in 1857 the Dexter Town Hall was in need of renovations to maintain the ability to be used by the Town. This historically significant Town building had not been used for several years and was in danger of being lost.

Financed by the Town and with a Community Development Block Grant, (C.D.B.G.), G.L. Frost Architecture worked with the building committee to prioritize needs, develop a budget and bring the project to fruition within that budget.

The new elevator and front entry are fully accessible and will allow the entire building to once again be used by all citizens of the Town of Dexter.
